This program is part of the Flower City Looking Good garden talk series sponsored by the City of Rochester.

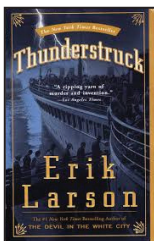
Saturday, May 20, from 11 a.m. – noon
