GUEST SPEAKER: JEAN FRANCE

We are fortunate to have as our guest speaker, Mrs. Jean France who teaches Architectural History at the University of Rochester. She is a Board Member of the Rochester Landmark Society and a member of the Rochester Preservation Board.

Mrs. France will give us an exciting lecture and slide presentation on LOST ROCHESTER. She will take us on an historical architectural tour, starting with the unsettled Genesee Falls frontier, on to early Rochester buildings and mills, and continue through to the lost Claude Bragdon Railroad Station.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT

Joseph Ancello, 89 Browncroft Boulevard
Joe is a life long resident of the area. He is self-employed and single. Prior to graduate school he was an assistant Scoutmaster and is presently active in soft ball. He was a candidate for City Council in 1975 running on the Conservative Ticket.

Joe sees the Neighborhood Association as a potential policy making group with an untapped resource of area talent. Although he believes the Neighborhood plays an important sociological role, he dislikes provincialism and feels the Association should have an increased metropolitan awareness and participation.

VICE PRESIDENT

Sue Tibbits, 145 Browncroft Boulevard
Sue has lived at 145 Browncroft for three years with her husband, Wes and their four children. She is a member of #46 School PTA and is active in Better Education Today in many capacities. Sue is a former NEAD Board Member.

Sue considers the Association a mechanism to help our neighbors deal with the area's long range planning. She believes an important value of this neighborhood is its originality and variety exhibited in its people, homes and streets and she would like to see this quality of life maintained.

Matthew Felo, 22 Quentin Road

Matt has lived at 22 Quentin Rd. with his wife and two children for four years. He has been a member of the Association since its inception.

Matt feels that the Neighborhood Association should be an active force to improve the area and act as a link between the Neighborhood and City Hall. By doing this, we will be able to preserve the quality of the Neighborhood and have some input in what the City has planned.

TREASURER

Susan O'Brien, 115 Windemere Road (for reelection)

Sue was born and raised in Rochester and has been a resident of Windemere for four years with her husband Tom and their three children. She is a graduate of the University of Rochester and a former nursery school teacher. Sue has been very involved in "Better Education Today" and worked closely with #46 School on Community School Nights.

Sue states that the role of the Neighborhood Association is to foster a sense of the Community so that if a problem arises people feel comfortable working together.

Linda Teague, 63 Browncroft Boulevard

Linda lives at 63 Browncroft with her husband and son. She is a graduate architect and planner and is employed by the City of Rochester as an Urban Designer.

Linda thinks the role of the Neighborhood Association is to preserve or improve aspects of the Neighborhood that affect all of the residents. It should serve as a forum to discuss issues and as a vehicle to actively deal with common problems.

RECORDING SECRETARY

Rochelle (Rocky) Blair, 205 Browncroft Boulevard

Rocky and her husband Tom have lived here for one year. She is employed by Informational Associates as a Receptionist Secretary. She was active in the Delray Citizen Association in Alexandria, Virginia as a recording secretary and has currently been active as a Traffic Committeeperson in our Association. She is presently involved in Better Education Today and served as their Raffle Chairperson.

Rocky believes the role of the Association is to create a community feeling and to identify problems which residents can unite to attack. She thinks that Community School Nights was a very positive step and would like to see more of this type of activity.

Kay Melnyk, 296 Yarmouth Road

Kay has lived on Yarmouth for five years with her husband and their two children. She's a Street Representative on Yarmouth Rd.

Kay feels the Association has three purposes; to express people's ideas of the Community, to recognize the problems and strength within the Neighborhood, and to provide a means to solve problems and preserve the strength of the City, using whatever area of Government is most appropriate.
