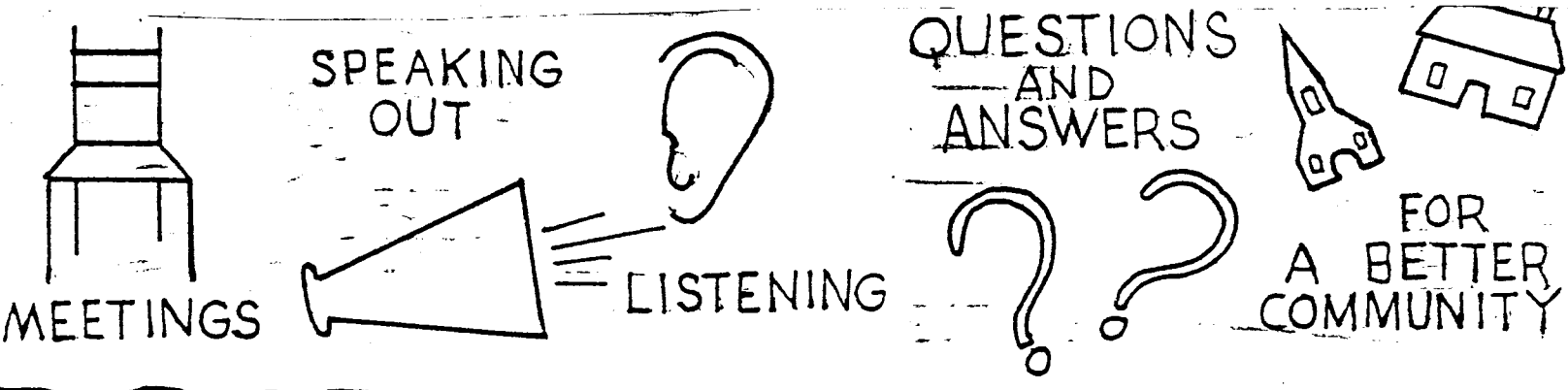

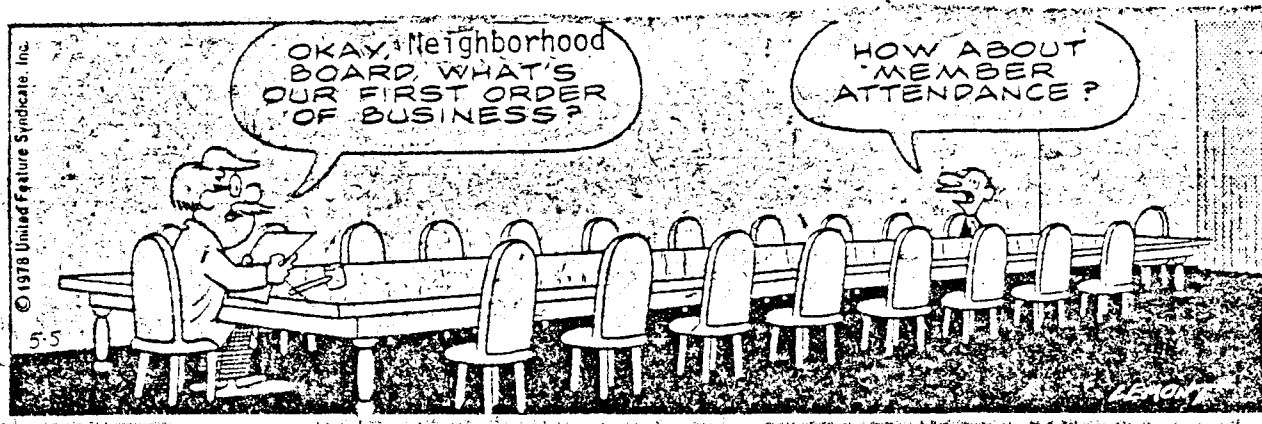


BROWNCROFT NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION IS UNDERWAY FROM NOW THROUGH SEPTEMBER.

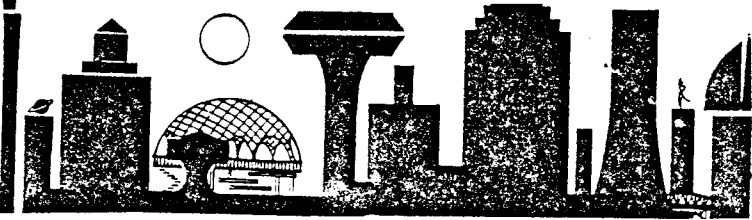

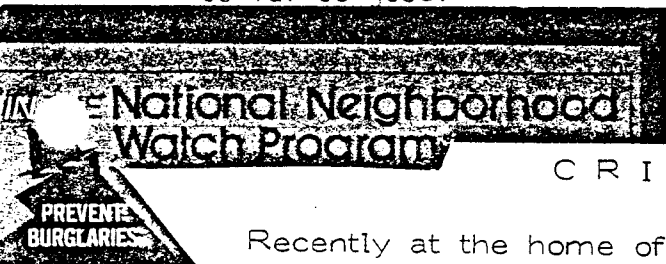

Recently at the home of Donna and Jack Doll 46 Gaslight Lane the City of Rochester Police Department's Crime Prevention Officer, Tom Gallagher gave a presentation introducing the "NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH" program.

Among the many benefits offered by the program are

- 1 Neighborhood Watch door and window stickers
- 2 Information on a home security survey conducted by the Rochester Police Department
3. An engraver for the identification program *
- 4 Information on how to set up a "Telephone Chain" in your neighborhood

Neighborhood Watch can be an effective tool in Crime Prevention for our neighborhood. It could prevent that "burglar" from entering your home.

Dec. - Christmas Party at Valley Echo being planned

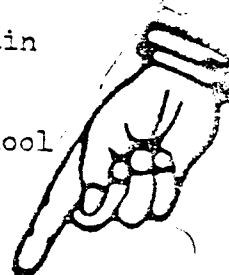
Mar.- City Fair Celebration sponsored by City of Rochester with the neighborhood assoc. hoping to participate again

WPJC, A NEIGHBORHOOD RADIO STATION

FIRST !!!

Please read the short message

For the last three years a group of teenagers, Dave Arman, Mike Baldwin, Peter Cooke, and Justin Foy, who live in the Browncroft area, have been involved with the neighborhood radio station which they have named WPJC.

At first the station was piped through the studio location on Windemere Rd. Then an AM transmitter kit was purchased and the station could be heard up to three houses away. The need to improve stayed with this group of kids until they had an even stronger FM transmitter broadcasting up to a half-mile away.

In May of 1979 the wheels of government turned and a cease order was issued by the Federal Communications Commission. The programming of music, news, weather, sports and community events was stopped.

The people involved in WPJC would like to survey this community to determine the needs of the area and to see how a radio station would meet those needs.
