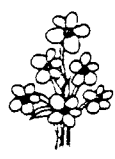

It is hoped that a program can be set up locally for training those interested in order to be ready to audit area homes by next year. A COMMENT: BNA is very pleased with the numerous sidewalk slabs replaced over the southern half of the Browncroft area by the City. It definitely is a plus for the appearance of our neighborhood. However, the City stopped short of repairing those on Merchants Road that they promised in writing for the past two (2) years. This gravel stone path had been included in the sidewalk program for 1978 and 1979. The City did not inform us of the pending work now accomplished nor have they explained why Merchants Road was skipped again. The neighbors in the area that was repaired should also have been informed of the noise, lawn and driveway damage that were to occur and the plans and schedule for repairs which it turned out was not accomplished for up to 5 weeks. The City continuously requests BNA to participate in their promotions, input to their programs, attend their Community Development functions - but fail in communicating to us pending activities in road, sidewalk, zoning and other matters that impact directly the Browncroft area. Let's hope the City soon recognizes the need for two-way participation through communication.
