
Please use the direct deposit service offered at areas banks for your social security checks. Having your check directly deposited eliminates the possibility of theft or misplacement.




WELCOME TO OUR NEIGHBORHOOD ...

#### BUS TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

On September 1, the Regional Transit Service (RTS) stopped sending buses down Newcastle Road. -The 0008 new route #8 goes along Blossom Rd. and then back on Browncroft. The route change came about primarily through the efforts of the Transit encla Committee of the BNA headed by more Craig Wilson of Newcastle Road. The group conducted & survey of the migade neighborhood and then injet with RIPS 13 officials to voice the areas opposition to heavy bus traffic on residential streets.

RTS proved sympathetic to the complaints and agreed to a rerouting. Since the change, Newcastle Road residents have felt a measure of calm return to their street which had suffered 76 buses a day since last spring. Thank you RTS!

# OUR BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE AT WORK AGAIN...

 May - large groups of neighbors worked to prepare the Park for Garden Day

 July - City Dept of Parks weeded and mulched beds

 Neighbors have been weeding, spraying, all summer

 October will be a scheduled cleanup and bulb planting and the city will winter over the rosebushes

Update on Tree damage from sidewalk repair in 1979. The 9 most heavily damaged trees that were located on private lots on Corwin were pruned and fertilized to minimize root damage. This work was privately contracted and paid for by the Dept of Engineering.

#### CHANGES TO ROUTE #47 EXPRESSWAY...

Expressway lighting was the main concern of the May 27th informational meeting with area residents and the City Dept of Engineering. The neighbors voiced their opposition to a proposed 90 foot tower with 4 high powered lights at the Browncroft interchange.

A letter was sent to the NYSDOT outlining the meeting and the residents' objections.

The final results are as follows:

- l. no high mast pole for the Browncroft interchange
- 2. Blossom interchange will receive improvements but will not be closed
- 3. Additional lane in each direction will be added in center mall (originally designed for eventual expansion) with light posts on top of that instead of at the outer sides of the lanes.
