The Browncroft Neighborhood Association will have a General Meeting on Crime Prevention in our Neighborhood on November 10 at Emmanuel Covenant Church at 7:30PM. The following message is from Officer John Dodge who will be our speaker for the evening:

"It has come to the attention of the Highland Section of the Rochester Police Department that a number of incidents have occurred in the Browncroft Area over the summer that were not reported to the police. Therefore, we could not allocate our resources to address these problems properly. Do not hesitate to call the police even for seemingly minor incidents as they can, if unchecked, escalate to more serious crime. For emergencies call 428-6666 - for non-emergency reporting 428-7070."

Attend this meeting to learn more about crime prevention techniques especially the PAC-TAC Patrol Program (Police & Citizens Together Against Crime). The Browncroft Area needs volunteers to walk a police style beat with other citizens and communicate directly to police, by radio, any suspicious activities.
