#### NEAD NEWS

You are invited to NEAD's Annual Meeting and Pancake Breakfast on Saturday, October 26, from 9 until 12 Noon at the Covenant United Methodist Church, 1124 Culver Road. This is your opportunity to meet with your neighbors, enjoy an excellent breakfast (all you can eat for \$3.50 a person) and voice your vote, as a NEAD member, for officers and issues. Call NEAD for tickets.

Free smoke detectors are still available from NEAD - also free fire extinguishers for those who sign up for a  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour course on proper use of extinguishers.

Operation Edith stands for Exit Drills in the Home. It is a procedure which, if practiced, can aid family members in escaping safely from a fire in their home. It shows people how to develop a fire escape plan, how to practice the plan and how to put the plan into action. Pamphlets are available at NEAD which explains how to make EDITH work for you. The Rochester Fire Department and NEAD are sponsoring a city-wide Operation Edith on Thursday, October 10, encouraging every family to sit down together, draw up a simple floor plan of the entire house and map out an alternative escape route from each room in case the usual means of escape is blocked by fire. Then at 7PM that Thursday actually practice EDITH making sure all the windows and storm windows will open. Make sure all the family members know the emergency escape routes from all the rooms in the house, not just their bedrooms and also make sure that you gather at a designated central meeting place outside your home. If you would like more information about EDITH, smoke detectors or fire safety in general, call the Fire Department at 428-7037.

The first recital of the 1985-1986 Covenant Music Series will be held on Sunday, October 27 at 2:30PM at the Emmanuel Covenant Church. The Covenant Music Series is a series of three recitals held annually at Emmanuel Covenant Church which utilize the purely mechanical ("tracker") organ built by A. David Moore. The organ was built using 17th and 18th century principles of design; hence the series has an early-music emphasis. J. William Greene will present a recital of North German Advent and Christmas music. The program will feature works of the "North German Organ School": Sweelinck, Scheidt, Buxtehude and J. S. Bach.
